Old Dominion University had its formal beginning in 1930 as a branch of the College of William and Mary and has since matured into an independent state institution with over 21,000 students. The 200-acre campus is bound on two sides by the Lafayette and Elizabeth rivers; its northern section reflects the influence of the College of William and Mary in its Georgian architecture, stately trees, and basket-weave brick walks. The southern section of the campus includes an eight-acre mall bordered by most of the University's academic buildings.



Old Dominion University is located in Norfolk, Virginia, the center of a metropolitan area with a population of approximately 1.6 million. Norfolk is the hub of the world's largest natural harbor and is regarded as a national leader in business

and industry. As part of a major recreational area known for its beaches and historical landmarks, Norfolk also profits from its relationship with the Navy, its proximity to Washington, D.C., and the Outer Banks of North Carolina.



Academics

Colleges and Programs

The University offers 68 bachelor's, 60 master's and 35 doctoral degrees, and two educational specialist degree programs. The academic programs are found within our six colleges: Arts and Letters, Business and Public Administration, Education, Engineering and Technology, Health Sciences, and Sciences.

Flexibility

With nearly 100 graduate programs, there is a degree that will meet your needs. Additionally, graduate courses are taught during the day and in the evening, facilitating flexible combinations of formal learning and full- or part-time employment. Likewise, in addition to courses offered at the main campus in Norfolk, Old Dominion University serves about 4,500 students through almost 60 distance learning sites in Virginia, D.C., Arizona, Illinois, Washington and Georgia. Locally, the University operates higher education centers in Virginia Beach, Portsmouth and Hampton.

The University Libraries

The University operates three libraries on ODU's main campus – the Perry Library, the Diehn Composer's Room and the Hofheimer Art Library. The Perry Library is open on most nights until midnight, providing working professionals with access to the library well after normal business hours. General Information

Students seeking master's, educational specialist or doctoral degrees from Old Dominion University should submit an Application for Graduate Admission. Graduate applicants have completed (or will complete) bachelor's degrees from a regionally accredited institution or an equivalent degree from a foreign institution. Graduate admission is competitive and specific requirements vary by program. Graduate admission decisions are made by the individual graduate departments and several factors are taken into consideration. Graduate applicants may be admitted as regular or provisional degree-seeking students.

Regular - An applicant who meets the individual program admission requirements, as determined by the graduate program director, may be admitted to regular graduate study.

Provisional - An applicant whose credentials have been received but who does not fully meet the requirements for regular admission may be admitted as a provisional graduate student. After successful completion of at least 12 hours of graduate work, the graduate program director may change the status from provisional to regular admission. Previously earned non-degree credits may not be included for purposes of satisfying the provisional 12-hour requirement. Credits earned as a provisional student may be applied toward the fulfillment of degree requirements.

Non-degree Status - Applicants who possess a bachelor's degree may complete a non-degree admission application and, at the discretion of the graduate program director, be permitted to register for graduate-level coursework. Transcripts from each college or university previously attended are required before the completion of six graduate credit hours. Graduate work taken as a non-degree student carries full graduate credit, but does not necessarily apply toward a degree at Old Dominion University.

No more than 12 hours of graduate-level coursework taken as a non-degree student may be applied toward a graduate degree or certificate. A student may take more than 12 hours as a non-degree student, with the permission of the dean of graduate studies. The graduate program director will determine which of the courses may be applied toward the degree should the student be admitted to the program. Non-degree students are not eligible for federal financial aid. International graduate applicants seeking non-degree status should complete and submit the international non-degree application to the Office of International Admissions. Certain visa types do not allow non-degree study.

English Proficiency Requirements - Graduate applicants who are non-native speakers of English must provide evidence of English proficiency through one of the following: TOEFL score of 550 (CBT 213, IBT 79); GRE verbal score of 480; an IELTS overall band of 6.5; CPE grade of A, B or C or the possession of a bachelor's or master's degree from an accredited institution located in a country where the native language is English. Individual departments may have higher TOEFL score requirements for teaching or research assistants. Writing proficiency is monitored throughout a graduate student's course of study at ODU. Some writing will be required in all courses, and will be evaluated for form and quality, as well as for content.

Foreign Credentials - Old Dominion University evaluates all foreign academic transcripts. All documents must be official, sealed and sent directly from the previous institution(s). Academic records must include the name of each course, the grading scale and the grades earned. Transcripts should be submitted in both the student's native language and English. If the English translation is not readily available, a government-sponsored translation is acceptable. Credential evaluations completed by an evaluation service cannot be accepted as official documentation.

Credit by Transfer and Extension Study - Except in the case of planned, coordinated interinstitutional programs, a maximum of 12 semester hours of graduate credit may be transferred for credit toward any graduate degree or certificate. Transfer credit may be awarded by the graduate program director. A special request for evaluation of transfer credits must be made by the student through the graduate program director during the first semester after admission to the degree program.

Deferment - Students may request to defer the term of entry for up to one year by writing to the Office of Graduate Admissions. Requests for deferments should be received no later than the second week of classes for the semester in which the original application was made. The request should include name, University Identification Number, signature, original entry term and deferred term.

Once admitted to a graduate program, students may defer for more than one year with special approval by the graduate program director.

Continuance Requirements - All graduate students, degree and non-degree alike, must meet the graduate continuance requirements as stated in the current University Catalog. Failure to meet these requirements will subject students to probation or dismissal. Details on graduate status and continuance requirements are found in the catalog. Students are responsible for familiarizing themselves with Old Dominion University's graduate policies and procedures.

Financial Aid - Financial aid is available in the form of fellowships, scholarships and research and teaching assistantships. Full tuition scholarships are available in some programs. Financial assistance deadlines may be as much as six months prior to the admission application deadlines. Questions regarding assistantships and the availability of scholarships should be directed to the graduate program director.

Low-interest, deferred repayment graduate loans are also available to U.S. citizens who can demonstrate need. Students submit the FAFSA, Free Application for Federal Student Aid, to the Department of Education for consideration. For more information, please visit www.odu.edu/financialaid. Federal financial aid is not available to students seeking or holding F-1 or J-1 visas.

- Completed and signed application for graduate admission with the \$40 non-refundable fee.
- An official college transcript from each college or university attended. Please read policy concerning foreign credentials on page 6.
- Required Official Test Scores - TOEFL (if your native language is not English), GRE, GMAT, etc. ... must be sent directly to Old Dominion University from Educational Testing Service (ETS).
- Resume
- Letters of Recommendation
- Essay – 500 words describing professional objectives, preparation for graduate study, personal and academic goals, and how the chosen program will help achieve goals and objectives (unless otherwise specified in the graduate program by colleges section of this booklet).
- Application for In-State Tuition – To be eligible for in-state tuition rates, applicants need to complete the enclosed Application for In-State Tuition. If this form is not submitted, the applicant will automatically be designated as out-of-state status. This form must be submitted for financial aid consideration.

Additional Forms

- To be considered for institutional financial assistance, submit the Application for Institutional Graduate Financial Assistance (page 25). For federally funded financial assistance, submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form to the Department of Education. Federal financial assistance is not available to students holding or seeking F-1 or J-1 visas.
- Complete the scholarship form for Continuing Graduate Students between December 1 and February 15 for additional scholarship consideration. Form can be found at www.odu.edu/financialaid
- To apply for Veterans Administration benefits, submit a court-certified copy of the Notice of Separation (Form DD214) or the Separation Qualification Record to the Old Dominion Office of Military Student Services within the Registrar's Office, (757) 683-4425.
