Freshman Applicants

Freshman applicants are students who are currently enrolled in high school or who graduated from high school within the past two years and have not attended any regionally accredited college or university (not to include dual enrollment). Freshman admission is competitive and several factors are considered during the freshman application review:

Academic Involvement - Level to which student is enrolled in a challenging program of study.

Academic Achievement - Cumulative grade point average (weighted).

Standardized Test Scores - SAT or ACT. We use the highest combination of SAT scores for admission. Old Dominion University's CEEB code - 5126.

Resume - Required - form attached or submit personal resume.

Essay - Optional - minimum of 400 typed words on a topic of choice (strongly encouraged for scholarship consideration).

Letters of Recommendation - Optional - form attached or submit written letter.

Additional Credentials - Additional grades or credentials may be requested by the Admissions committee.

Freshman Checklist

Please submit the following materials:

- Completed and signed Old Dominion University undergraduate admission application.
- \$40 non-refundable application fee or application fee waiver.
- Official high school transcript(s) or GED scores.
- Official standardized test scores from the SAT or ACT. Scores are accepted if posted directly on the official high school transcript or if received directly from the Educational Testing Service.
- Resume
- Essay
- Letters of Recommendation

Non-Traditional Freshman Applicants

Non-traditional freshman applicants are students who graduated from high school more than two years ago and have not enrolled at any regionally accredited college or university. Refer to freshman checklist. Note: non-traditional freshmen are not required to submit standardized test scores.

Transfer Applicants

Transfer applicants are students who have previously attended another regionally accredited college or university after the completion of a high school diploma or GED.

Please submit the following materials:

- Completed and signed Old Dominion University admission application.
- \$40 non-refundable application fee or application fee waiver.
- Official transcripts from ALL previously attended colleges or universities. Transcripts must be in the original sealed envelope provided by the previously attended institution(s). Official transcripts submitted in native languages other than English must be accompanied by an official translation.
- Official high school transcript(s) in the original sealed envelope provided by the high school (if fewer than 24 transferable semester hours have been earned).
- Resume - Required - form attached or submit personal resume.
- Essay - Optional - minimum of 400 typed words on a topic of choice.
- Letters of Recommendation - Optional - form attached or submit written letter.

Second Degree Applicants

Second degree applicants are students who have earned a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution and wish to pursue another bachelor's degree in a different field of study. Second degree decisions are made by the academic departments; however, the Office of Admissions is responsible for receiving the credentials.

Please submit the following materials:

- Completed and signed Old Dominion University admission application.
- \$40 non-refundable application fee or application fee waiver.
- Official transcripts from ALL previously attended colleges or universities. Transcripts must be in the original sealed envelope provided by the previously attended institution(s).

International Applicants

International applicants are students who are not U.S. citizens or U.S. permanent residents seeking a visa status.

Please submit the following materials to: Office of International Admissions, 220 Alfred B. Rollins Jr. Hall, Norfolk, VA 23529-0050, USA:

- Completed and signed Old Dominion University undergraduate admission application
- Official transcripts (ODU evaluates all foreign academic transcripts. All documents must be official, sealed and sent directly from the previous institution(s). Transcripts should be submitted in both the student's native language and English. Academic records must include the name of each course, the grading scale and the grades earned. If the English translation is not readily available, a government-sponsored translation is acceptable. Credential evaluations completed by an evaluation service cannot be accepted as official documentation.)
- TOEFL - If your native language is not English, or other proof of English language proficiency
- SAT (not required for international students but is strongly encouraged)

Important Information

Home-schooled Applicants

Home-schooled applicants should refer to the freshman checklist. The GED is not required for admission.

AP (Advanced Placement), IB (International Baccalaureate), CLEP (College Level Examination Placement) and DANTES (Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support)

Applicants seeking credit for AP, IB, CLEP or DANTES exams should submit official scores to the Office of Admissions. A listing of the scores required for the award of credit may be obtained by visiting admissions.odu.edu. AP or IB scores posted on the high school transcript are acceptable.

Dual Enrollment

Applicants who attend(ed) a college or university while in high school need to submit official transcripts from the college or university to receive credit for the dual enrollment courses. Students who earned college credit while in high school are not considered transfer students.

Senior Scholars Program

High school students with exceptional academic abilities who would like to be challenged by completing their senior year of high school at Old Dominion University should contact an admissions counselor for application and enrollment procedures.

English Language Proficiency Requirement

In addition to meeting the University's requirements for admission, non-native speakers of English (regardless of citizenship) must provide evidence of English language proficiency. This may be proven by submitting one of the following: a 550 TOEFL score or 213 CBT, a 480 verbal SAT score or a GCSE or GCE "O" level pass in English language, or an IELTS overall band score of 6.5.

Financial Affidavit of Support (required for all applicants seeking F or J visa status)

Academic decisions regarding University admission are determined without bias to financial support; however, you will not be eligible to obtain a proper visa without adequate financial support. For sponsorship purposes, an I-20/DS-2019 document is issued for a nine-month academic year; the estimated length of study is four years for bachelor's and doctoral degrees and two years for master's degrees. It is the applicant's responsibility to demonstrate sufficient funding to both Old Dominion University and the U.S. Consulate via a sponsor or one's personal finances. Valid sponsorship includes covering tuition and living expenses for the first year of study in addition to a reasonable expectation of funding for the remaining years.

Domicile

The Application for In-State Tuition (included in this application) must be completed to establish the student's domicile classification of in-state or out-of-state. If the Application for In-State Tuition is not completed and submitted to the Registrar's Office, the student will automatically be classified as out-of-state for tuition purposes.

Financial Aid

Applicants seeking financial aid need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The application is available at high schools, college financial aid offices, online at www.fafsa.ed.gov or by request from the U.S. Department of Education. Old Dominion University has a priority filing deadline of February 15 and the school code is 003728. Some merit-based scholarships require the FAFSA to be on file with the U.S. Department of Education; therefore, it is advisable that every student complete the FAFSA regardless of financial need. A financial aid transcript is also required from all other post-secondary schools attended.

Housing

The housing application deadline for fall semester is May 1. Housing cannot be offered or secured until you have been admitted. For additional information, please visit the housing Web site at: studentservices.odu.edu/housing
